A New Zealand Sign Language interpreted performance allows Deaf and hearing impaired patrons to enjoy a performance through the

addition of NZSL interpreters translating the dialogue from the stage. Circa hopes to offer its first NZSL interpreted play in 2013, for a performance of *Tribes* by Nina Raine.
